Thursday activities:

Commemorative Air Force Museum: We will travel to San Marcos to see one of our favorite P-39s, Miss Connie. Both the P-39 and their P-63 King Cobra will be flying. If this is not something you want to do, then there is an outlet mall nearby and we will arrange for a drop-off and pick-up before going to a late lunch or early dinner on the way back to San Antonio. The "on your own" lunch/dinner will be at the Gristmill Restaurant in Gruene.

There will be static displays on the flight line directly behind the squadron. Second Lieutenant Robert Thorpe Honored

Sixty nine years ago, in 1944, Robert Thorpe of the 39th Pursuit Squadron died at the hands of the enemy in New Guinea. He was only twenty years old.

On May 14, 2013 the Rhode Island (RI) House of Representatives honored one of their own, 2nd Lt. Robert Thorpe, with the passage of a House Resolution honoring the WW II pilot who died in the service of his country. This was followed by a ceremony held in the RI State House on May 17, 2013. A member of the 39th FSA, Capt (Ret) Lew Lockhart a flight commander and friend of Robert Thorpe, was present to pay his respects.

Joe Kernan is the Features Editor for the Cranston Herald, Cranston, RI. He is the author of the article about 2nd Lt. Robert Thorpe, and this article provided information (with his permission) to summarize the short, but very significant life, of Robert Thorpe.


At age eighteen, Robert Thorpe "stuffed himself with food to make the minimum weight for the Army Air Corp pilot training program during WW II". He was successful and commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in the Army Air Corp on August 30, 1943. As a P-47 Thunderbolt pilot, he was sent to New Guinea where he joined the 39th Pursuit Squadron in early 1944. On May 27, 1944, while on a strafing run of a Japanese garrison, his plane was hit by anti-aircraft fire. The last anyone saw of him was his plane ditching into the waters off Papua, New Guinea. The next day Fred Tobi, Robert's tent mate, and Lew Lockhart, who flew many missions with Robert, launched a search mission to find Robert. According to Lew, "We went back to the site where he went down, but didn't find anything at all".

What happened to 2nd Lt. Robert Thorpe was unknown until 1948 when the vivid details of his treatment after his capture were documented in the Yokohama War Crimes records. Although his plane sank, Robert made it to shore then his luck ran out as he was captured and taken to a Japanese naval base on Kairiru Island, New Guinea. The records show that during interrogation "Thorpe refused to supply any information other than name, rank and serial number", he was tortured and then executed. According to Lew Lockhart, "That is what makes him a true hero. He didn't give out any information. That's why they tortured him."

The painting represents the famous 5th Air Force battle over Buna, Papua, New Guinea on December 27, 1942. It features four P-38 Lockheed Lightnings flown by Capt. Tommy Lynch, 2/Lt. Dick Bong, 2/Lt. Ken Sparks, and 2/Lt. Johnny Mangas. The painting, and all the supporting research done by Gary Smith, was then presented to the 39th FTS to be displayed in their headquarters at Randolph AFB. The painting has now been framed and is on display, as promised. The 39th FSA also covered the cost of framing.
